

# Tanel Leok wins, Davide Guarneri third

41st International Motocross of Wuustwezel

LS Motors-Honda's Tanel Leok claimed his second win in a week's time. After the Spanish GP the Estonian Express won the International classic of Wuustwezel, in Belgium. In his first ever visit to the Molenbergen track team mate Guarneri took third behind Russia's Evgeny Bobryshev.

Leok was no stranger to the track, because he'd raced to second last year behind Max Nagl. Leok wanted to go one better this year and the fast Estonian immediately made his intentions clear during the qualifying session in the morning. Tanel took the pole, while team mate Guarneri was second ahead of Bobryshev, Van Daele and De Reuver.

It was Davide Guarneri who grabbed the holeshot in the opening moto. The Italian cruised on to an easy victory eventually. Behind Guarneri were Evgeny Bobryshev and Tanel Leok. However when the spectacular Bobryshev made a mistake with ten minutes to go he handed second to Leok on a silver plate.

A first corner collision was causing mayhem early on in the second MX1 moto. Among the many victims was the winner of the first race, Davide Guarneri. Luckily without notable damage to his body nor bike. Tanel Leok was able to fully capitalize on the situation and rode to a dominant win, crossing the line almost 37 seconds ahead of Bobryshev. Italian champion Guarneri put in a solid performance that dragged him up to 5th thus assuring his spot on the overall podium.

## Tanel Leok, winner

"The first race was okay, but I could not race with Guarneri because I had problems with my rear brake after about ten minutes. After that the second moto went a lot better. I grabbed the holeshot and could ride my own race. It was a bit difficult to stay focused because my clutch was behaving a bit strange. Also because the first heat of the year it was quite demanding although it was only a 25-minute sprint race. So it was definitely great in preparation for Glen Helen. I'm looking forward to racing in the US next weekend"

## Davide Guarneri, 3rd overall

"In the first moto I had the holeshot and I won without having to push very hard. During the first lap my body felt a little bit tense, but lap after lap I became more comfortable. That helped me to create a gap near the end. In the second heat I once again had a good start. However, this time the first turn had completely changed. I went too wide and crashed. Other riders went down behind me so it was complete mayhem. I found myself buried under two motorcycles, luckily I was fine. My bike was ok as well so I started to make my way up through the field. It was a bit of a shame that the heat was that short because otherwise I could have done better than fifth."
